The Share Shed is a library of things based in Totnes (Devon, UK), where people can borrow all sorts of useful things, ranging from tools, house appliances, camping and gardening equipment, sewing machines, and much more! It opens on Saturday mornings from 10am to 1pm.

The project enables local people to borrow items at nominal cost so that they don't have to buy them for themselves. The aim is to build a more resourceful community, allowing people to connect with each other and share things they may need just once in a while, which also reduces our impact on Earth's precious resources.

We are looking for people who are enthusiastic and would enjoy working at the Share Shed as well as help develop and promote it.

They will work alongside the Project Manager to:

- Run the Share Shed when open, including operating the lending system on the Share Shed website;
- Obtain the items for the Share Shed, sorting, labelling and photographing the items and uploading this information into the system;
- Assist with publicity for the project by putting up posters and contributing to social media;
- Assist with running events.
